Keynote

By promoting recovery, reducing stigma, and emphasizing a person-centered approach, evidence-based practices contribute significantly to the overall wellbeing and social inclusion of individuals within their communities. Evidencebased practices can challenge societal stigma surrounding mental health and empower individuals to engage more fully in community activities, thereby reducing isolation. Despite the overwhelming literature and local successes supporting evidence-based practices, there is a continued need for integration of culturally responsive care into these methodologies. By equipping staff, agencies, and communities with the tools to adapt programs based on local needs, disparities, and cultural practices, evidence-based practices can continue to serve an important role in Iowa's behavioral health service continuum.
